HAVE YOU EVER WONDERED, “What IS the DKG U.S. Forum?” The U.S. Forum has an International DKG budget and is responsible for informing DKG members in our country of current educational policies and topics. Elected officers on this committee have a block of time set aside for them to meet at international society conventions. At international conferences and conventions, they present oral reports about current educational topics. Throughout the year, the regional steering committee is responsible for informing their region’s state presidents and state organization U.S. Forum chairs about the work of the U.S. Forum. Nancy Sheng of the Northwest Regional Steering Committee is the Nebraska State Organization’s representative. In addition to the U.S. Forum, there are three other regional DKG forums: Canadian, European, and Latin American.



The DKG U.S. Forum National Legislative Seminar will be held soon on March 10–13 in Washington, DC. This seminar represents some of the work the U.S. Forum does for DKG. A couple of topics at this year’s seminar will be AI in the classroom and improving mental health services in schools. Also, seminar attendees will have the opportunity to meet with members of congress. You do not need to be a member of the U.S. Forum committee to attend these seminars. Time to Fill Those Baskets



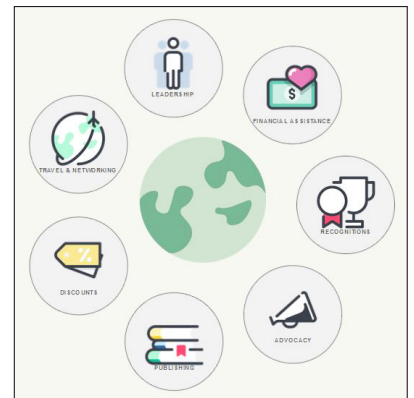
